

# EMERGENCY TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM



The Emergency and Transitional Housing (ETH) program provides limited funding to increase access to short-term housing for individuals at risk of homelessness and under the supervision of the Division of Probation and Parole or recently released from state incarceration. The ultimate goal is to improve justice-involved citizens' chances of having a successful reentry experience through improved access to transitional housing opportunities.

## What Does it Cover?

- Provides limited short-term funds for housing room & board
- Emergency Housing: Up to 2 weeks
- Transitional Housing: Up to 6 months, or supervision end date, whichever is sooner\*

*\*Full-term releases are eligible for 3 months only*

## What's Expected?

- The provider must be appropriately permitted and zoned
- Provide adequate sleeping accommodations and a place to store belongings
- Staff prepared meals or access to a kitchen for participants to prepare meals

## Why Participate in the ETH Program?

- Partner with the Department Of Corrections (DOC) to provide short-term housing to those in need
- Housing providers invoice DOC monthly for the prior months' ETH participants
- **Make a difference in someone's second chance!**

## Want to Become an ETH Provider?

- Must be a non-profit organization
- Applications are accepted in Spring and Fall every year
