In 2016, the United Way of Central Louisiana invested in 14 community partner agencies in central Louisiana. The funding recommendations of your donated dollars are made by our Community Investment Committee – a group of volunteers who review, analyze and evaluate all program applications that support Education, Income, Health and Basic Needs. Our community partner agencies must un-

dergo a rigorous application process, which includes a detailed application, site visits, and a presentation to the Community Investment Committee. Additionally, community partners must submit monthly financial reports along with their year-end IRS 990 and audit.

- Education Children will enter pre-k ready to learn, Youth will graduate high school, Adults are prepared and ready for the workforce
- Income Stability Clients align spending and saving with income
- Health Increase healthy behaviors and decrease unhealthy behaviors to promote personal and family safety
- Basic Needs Personal safety, shelter and food

NEW PARTNERSHIP FOR UNITED WAY!

In September, our United Way's board of directors approved a new partnership with the Rapides Parish School System to start a pilot after-school program at Huddle Elementa¬ry.

This is not just any after-school program. It's based on a set of quality standards for after-school education that have been shown to keep kids in school and help them succeed academically. Our ultimate goal is to improve the rate of high-school graduations in Rapides Parish, but that challenge is won or lost long before a student enters high school.

Building on the example of the excellent program at the Pineville Youth Center, the Huddle Elementary program will track the attendance and grades of forty students. Our United Way is funding transportation home after the program for those students who need it; without this, a number of students would be unable to participate.
